Places of Refreshment (Jersey) Law 1967: application to open on Sundays, Good Friday and Christmas Day

PRIVACY: Your Parish is registered with the Office of the Information Commissioner in Jersey and is a 'controller', as defined by the Data Protection (Jersey) Law 2018 (DPJL), of the information (personal data) you provide in connection with your application for a permit to open a place of refreshment on Sundays, Good Friday and Christmas Day under the Places of Refreshment (Jersey) Law 1967.

We collect: Your personal details (name, address and contact details, signature, position (if an authorised signatory) and the name and position of any person(s) who will manage the premises). We record the issue of any permit granted for the place of refreshment to open on a Sunday, Good Friday and Christmas Day. All personal data is stored securely and retained in accordance with your Parish's Data Retention Policy.

Our use of your personal data: Your Parish requires your personal data in order to process your application for the issue of a permit to open on Sundays, Good Friday and Christmas Day under the Places of Refreshment (Jersey) Law 1967.

Transfer of personal data to third parties: The Parishes have information sharing and other agreements in place between themselves and with other Government and Law Enforcement agencies and IT service providers. These serve to protect your information in accordance with the DPJL and set out what a third party may do with your personal data including to prevent and detect crime, for law enforcement or to protect individuals from harm or injury.

Your rights: You can ask us for a copy of the information we hold about you and to correct or update this. You can ask us to stop or restrict the processing of your personal data although we may need to cancel your permit to do so.
