

Application for inclusion of name on the Electoral Register

(Articles 5A(8) and 7(4)(c) of the Public Elections (Jersey) Law 2002)



You are entitled to register to vote if you are ordinarily resident in Jersey and

- You are 16 years old or over and
- You have lived in the Island for either:
 - A the last 2 years or
 - B the last 6 months plus additional period(s) that total at least 5 years

You can apply to register up to 3 months before your 16th birthday or up to 3 months before completing either of the residence periods.

All information you give us must be correct otherwise you may not be eligible to vote.

You can only be registered in one electoral district at any time.

Register online at <https://services.parish.gov.je/Election/RegisterToVote> or complete this application form and return it to the Parish where you are ordinarily resident so that the Electoral Register can be brought up to date. You can view the Electoral Register during office hours at the parish hall or you can telephone or email your Parish (contact details overleaf).

The Parish is a 'controller' under the Data Protection (Jersey) Law 2018 and we process and hold your information in order to administer public elections and jury service in accordance with our statutory obligations. Below, we explain what we collect; how we will use your information; and what your rights are.

We have collected your personal details (name; address; date of birth, residence criteria and, if provided, your occupation) in order to administer public elections and jury service in accordance with the Public Elections (Jersey) Law 2002 and the Loi (1864) Régulant la Procédure Criminelle (as amended or replaced) and the Loi (1912) sur la procédure devant la Cour Royale (as amended or replaced).

We will endeavour to keep your information accurate and up to date, although we rely on you to inform us of any changes in accordance with the Public Elections (Jersey) Law 2002. We do not keep your information for longer than is necessary. The Parish retains the Annual Statement for no more than 5 years.

We will share your personal details (name, address) with the Viscount's Department if you are eligible for jury service.

The Electoral Register at 1 September contains your name and address and is, by law, available for public inspection at the Jersey Library and the Judicial Greffe. The Electoral Register may also be inspected at the Parish offices.

We do not process your information overseas using web services that are hosted outside the European Economic Area. At no time will your information be passed to organisations for marketing or sales purposes or for any commercial use without your prior express consent.

You can ask us: to stop processing your information; to correct or amend your information; for a copy of the information we hold about you. You can also: request that the processing of your personal data is restricted (in certain circumstances); and withdraw your consent to the processing of your information.
