Number of incidents attended by St John's Honorary Police in 2017/2018/2019;	<p>The Parish has determined that this information is exempt under Article 16 of the Freedom of Information (Jersey) Law 2011, as it is estimated that it will take in excess of 5 hours to collect the information.</p> <p>Exemption applied</p> <p>Article 16: A scheduled public authority may refuse to supply information if cost excessive</p> <p>(1) A scheduled public authority that has been requested to supply information may refuse to supply the information if it estimates that the cost of doing so would exceed any fee of an amount determined in the manner prescribed by Regulations for the purposes of Article 15.</p> <p>Justification for exemption</p> <p>The key reasons are the information is not recorded by incident and the time required to review, extract and collate the information from all the pocket notebooks of members of the Honorary Police during 2017/2018/2019 will exceed the cost limit provisions.</p>

How much was the Dacia police vehicle and how much is this vehicle to maintain per year since purchase.	<p>This information is exempt under Article 23 of the Freedom of Information (Jersey) Law 2011. See exemption details below.</p> <p>FOI exemption applied: Article 23 - Information accessible to applicant by other means Information is absolutely exempt information if it is reasonably available to the applicant, otherwise than under this Law, whether or not free of charge.</p> <p>Justification for exemption The information is available in the Parish accounts which are available for inspection at the Parish Hall.</p> <p>The cost of the Dacia police vehicle was £16,000 (2014 accounts) and maintenance costs are recorded in the annual accounts.</p>
How many officer hours have officers been on duty within the parish per week	An Honorary Police officer is on duty 24/7 so 168 hours in a week. Each week 3 or 4 officers are on duty so that is between 504 and 672 hours each week.
How many TETRA Police radios are provided to officers? And where are the radios stored when not being used?	10 radios are available to officers and are stored in a secure, locked location when not in use.
To what level are Honorary officers in St John vetted to?	Centeniers are subject to Non-Police Personnel Vetting Level 2; all other Honorary Police officers are subject to personal vetting checks.
What equipment (as standard) is provided to Honorary Officers in St John.	Standard equipment is a pocket notebook, warrant card, torch and suitable clothing as preferred by the honorary officer (this ranges from a vest/tabard to jacket/trousers).
How many officers do St John's have currently elected; how many have completed the basic training and how many officers have attended CPD days for continuous development.	14 currently elected; 9 have completed training and 5 are receiving training. There is no formal CPD programme but on-going training is provided as required.
How many speed devices (Unipar Speed device) does the Parish own, when was the last calibration of the device, how many times has the device been booked out in 2017/2018/2019. How many trained officers do St John's have?	One device. Last calibration July 2019. Four officers are currently trained to use the device. No information is held on the number of times the device has been booked out in 2017/2018/2019.
In relation to Smiley Speed Indication Devices, does the Parish own and deploy any of these, if so, when was the last deployment and location and what have the results been from the device. If the Parish do have a SID and it is not deployed, why is this the case?	The Parish has one device which is currently deployed at Sorel but the results have not yet been extracted.
