**Reading of the Convening Notice**

Parish Secretary, Mrs A Goguelin read out the following convening notice as advertised in the Church Box and Jersey Gazette:

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1. To receive and if deemed advisable approve the Minutes of the Act of the Parish Assembly held on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2014; these are on display at the Parish Hall.

The Minutes of 16<sup>th</sup> April 2014 were taken as read, proposed by Deputy John Le Fondré and seconded by Centenier Nicola Parker-Hood. On a vote all were in favour, none against. The Connétable then signed the Minutes as approved.

2. To consider and if deemed advisable, to recommend to the Licensing Assembly the following application by virtue of the Licensing (Jersey) Law 1974:

The Connétable introduced the applicant, Mr Anthony William Sargeant, to the Assembly. The Connétable explained that Mr Sargeant was representing himself and then invited Mr Sargeant to address the Assembly.

Mr Sargeant informed the Assembly that the Third Category (Restaurant) application was for the Café and Cider Barn at Hamptonne, Country Life Museum. Outlining his background, he explained that he was born in Jersey and had managed his own businesses for the past 29 years, including restaurants known as Blue Fish and Mamma Mia's. He had been approached by Jersey Heritage in this instance, who had asked him to run the catering facilities at Hamptonne.

Mr Sargeant assured the Assembly that there was not a public bar in the café, the application was to provide alcohol for café patrons only, for which there were 36 covers inside the building, with other seating areas outside. The intention was to improve conditions for visitors to the museum by allowing them to enjoy local cider and beer with their meal. His company had also been approached to cater for private functions (such as wedding receptions) and that had the backing of Jersey Heritage. Mr Sargeant assured the Assembly that he had no plans to open in the evenings, other than to cater for such private functions and those that Jersey Heritage have planned in their calendar i.e. the annual Cider Festival, usually held in October. Centenier Parker-Hood enquired how many extra events they were planning to do and Mr Sargeant informed the Assembly that they have 6 weddings booked between now and 2016.

The Connétable then explained to the Assembly that she had received the required reports from the Fire Service and Public Health as well as a Surveyors Report, after which she invited questions from the Assembly.

Reverend Phil Warren asked whether the application had the support of nearby residents, to which Mr Sargeant replied that he had not approached the residents as he was operating



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within the opening hours of the museum, being from 10.00am until 4.30pm. The Connétable informed the Assembly that the hours permitted to serve alcohol on a Third Category Licence are specified under Article 43 of the Licensing (Jersey) Law 1974.

The Rector also requested clarification on the type of licence being applied for and Mr Sargeant explained that a Third Category was a Restaurant Licence, requiring table service for the serving of alcohol with a meal.

Procureur Michael Ethelston enquired how much alcohol would be kept on the premises? Mr Sargeant informed the Assembly that as he intended only to stock Liberation Ale, La Robeline Cider and house red and white wine, the answer was that not a large amount would be kept on the premises.

The Connétable asked how many staff would be working at the café and whether they would receive training in the serving of alcohol. Mr Sargeant informed the Assembly that he had two staff; his wife and another adult and that he would be training them in the serving of alcohol.

Mr Hugh Gill addressed the Assembly and informed them that he had known Mr Sargeant for 25 years, knew him to be a family man and that he had no objection in him taking on the licence.

The Connétable asked Mr John Emmanuel if he was satisfied with everything that had been mentioned, as he was the closest neighbour to Hamptonne. Mr Emmamuel replied that he was satisfied and that he did not have a problem with visitors to the site as they park in the car park.

There being no further questions, the Connétable informed the Assembly that those who had spoken were welcome to attend the Licensing Bench on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2014 at 10 am in the Royal Court.

The application was then formally proposed by Mr Hugh Gill and seconded by Mr Jamie Le Sueur, on a show of hands all were in favour, none against.

There being no further business the Connétable closed the meeting at 7.22pm.
