



PARISH OF ST MARY

MINUTES OF THE ELECTORAL ASSEMBLY
HELD AT ST MARY'S PARISH HALL
ON 11 April, 2018

Pursuant to a certain Act of the Royal Court dated 23 March 2018, whereby it was ordered that an election be held to fill the office of Connétable de Ste Marie.

Pursuant also to Article 19 Elections (Jersey) Law 2002, Notice was given in that an Assembly of Electors of the Parish of St Mary would be held at St Mary's Parish Hall on Wednesday 11 April 2018 at 8pm to proceed with the said election in conformity with the aforesaid Act of the Royal Court.

Mr Derek Maltwood confirmed that as the Connétable was a candidate in the upcoming election and, in accordance with Article 20(2) of the Public Elections (Jersey) Law 2002, he would preside at the meeting. The Assembly was observed by Susie Latta from the Commonwealth Parliament Association.

Mr Maltwood then read the notice convening the meeting, confirming in accordance with the law, the convening notice had been placed in the Jersey Gazette and he had received the copy placed in the Parish church box which had been signed by the Ministre Desservant Very Reverend M Keirle.

Mr Maltwood then detailed that the purpose of the meeting was to nominate candidates for the position of Connétable. It was noted that each proposer would read the nomination paper for their candidate which would then be passed to the Chair along with the declaration of convictions and there would be an opportunity later in the meeting for the candidates to thank their proposer and seconders, should they wish.

In conformity with the aforesaid Act of the Royal Court, Mr Maltwood then asked if there were any nominations for the position of Connétable.

Mr Brian Wood proposed Mr John Michael Le Bailly as a Candidate for Connétable and read the nomination paper and declarations as required by law. The nomination paper was seconded by Mr John Clarence Huelin, Mr Martin de Gruchy, Mr Peter Le Rossignol, Major Bernard Ralph Baldwin, Mr Michael Lewis Cotillard, Mr Alan Victor Le Breton, Mr Iain Macleod, Mrs Joy Ann Le Gresley and Mr Robin Noel Pittman. Mr Wood then made a speech as to why he thought Mr Le Bailly would be a good candidate for Connétable, then handed the nomination paper to the Chair.

Mr Martyn Samphier then proposed Mrs Juliette Gallichan as a candidate for Connétable and read the nomination paper and declarations as required by law. The nomination paper was seconded by Mrs Shirley Anne Baudains, Mrs Clare Olga Duval, Mr Anthony John Staples, Mr Gordon John Herve, Mr Allan Moullin,

Ms Emma Bennetts, Mrs Pamela Joan Gallichan, Mr David Vincent Langlois and Mrs Sandra Genee. Mr Samphier then made a speech as to why he thought Mrs Juliette Gallichan would be a good candidate for Connétable of Ste. Marie, then handed the nomination paper with declaration form to the Chair.

After 10 minutes had elapsed and according to Law, the meeting was called to order and as no further nominations had been received, the Mr Maltwood declared that an election between the nominated Candidates will take place on 16 May 2018 at St Mary's Parish Hall, with a Hustings Meeting to be arranged in the near future.

The candidates were asked if they wished to say a few words of thanks. Each candidate stood and said a few words of thanks in the order that they were proposed.

Mr Maltwood requested that the nominated candidates remain after the close of the meeting to discuss what, if any, arrangements they may wish to make for a hustings.

There being no further business, the Procureur formally closed the meeting at 8:15pm.
