



Duty Vingtenier - Role and Responsibilities

- As duty Vingtenier you are on duty 24 hours for 7 days, you will have your own team of CO's.
- While on duty it is expected of you to hold the Parish mobile phone and answer all calls.
- This then becomes your responsibility to answer all calls within a 24/7 duty period.
- It is expected that the oncoming duty Vingtenier must be at the Parish Hall on the Wednesday night for Parish Hall enquiries and to take over the duty from the off coming Vingtenier.
- The off coming Vingtenier is also expected to be at the enquiries night to hand over and exchange information about duties, also to assist the Centeniers with Parish Hall enquiries.
- When on duty as Vingtenier you can be called upon for assistance within the 24/7 period, it is your responsibility to answer all calls within that 24/7 period.
- Should you receive a call from the Duty Centenier when on duty, as Vingtenier you have Co's to call upon as required.
- All Officers must be made aware that they could be called upon at any time in the event of an all island emergency.
- Training is provided for all eventualities of Policing once accepted and sworn in as an officer arrangements will be with your representative parish training officer responsible.
- Patrolling duties is mainly done on a Friday and Saturday night. It is expected that the Duty Vingtenier will organise their week duties in conjunction with the Duty Centenier and would arrange to at least do one patrol with his team during the duty week.



- There are other matters that have to be addressed more frequently such as curfews; the duty Vingtenier must make himself responsible to know this information, inform the duty Centenier when coming on duty and discuss with the duty team coming on duty when they can be done. One visit is expected to be done at any time during the duty week.
- Licensed Premises must also be checked regularly to ensure Licence details are correct.
- Unless the Chef de Police is on Holiday or medically absent from duty that person will always be contactable, you can also make contact with your duty or any other Centenier if required to do so.
- It is expected that all officers planning holidays inform the Chef and duty Centenier giving as much notice as possible if it's going to affect your duty week. Illness must be informed if it's only going to affect the duty week.
- All Officers are expected to attend the Parish Monthly Police meeting to gather and pass on information, circumstances are accepted for non-attendance.
