The Parish of St Saviour and Government of Jersey are working together on Safer Routes to Schools as part of the St Saviour's Schools Action Plan. The St Saviour's School Action Plan aims to:

- encourage walking, cycling and bus use
- reduce car use and congestion
- Provide safer and healthy travel options

The Parish and Government have received concerns about the roads as walking routes, particularly for students who use the bus service to and from Jersey College for Girls bus park and walk to Hautlieu School. We are working together to make the area safer for all road users.

The proposals for a zebra crossing were well supported with 79% of the replies saying it would be beneficial. The Minister for Infrastructure has approved the scheme and detailed design is being undertaken with the target of construction during the school summer holidays this year. This will provide a safer link to walk to Bagatelle Lane and the bus stop.

The returned questionnaires, from the drop-in consultation and website, showed strong community support for safety improvements and a proposal has been developed to address the main concerns and issues raised and adopts ideas put forward.

We want to know your thoughts on the proposal to improve the lane for all who walk and live in the lane.
