An Assembly of the Principals and Electors of the Parish of Trinity was duly convened and held in the Parish Hall on Thursday 24th November 2016 at 7.00 pm to:-

The Connétable welcomed everyone to the meeting. Apologies were received from Reverend G J Houghton and Centenier Mrs S E Jones.

The Minutes of the previous meeting held on 27th October 2016 were read and adopted on the proposition of Mr P R Williams and seconded by Mrs A P Le Sueur.

The following applications were then received by the meeting –

Woodside Flowers Ltd was represented by Mrs Sarah Greenwood who informed the Assembly that the shop would be predominantly a florist shop which would be running alongside Woodside Farm Shop. On the proposition of Mr D J Hinault and seconded by Mr J Le S Gallichan, it was recommended that the application for a Sixth Category Licence by Woodside Flowers Ltd was unanimously recommended to the Licensing Bench.

Citriche Ltd was represented by Mr Lake who explained that Sandpiper was a company owned by Citriche who were proposing to purchase the Costcutter businesses which would be transferred from Spar to Citriche Ltd. These would be rebranded as foodhalls and depending on the time that his would take, may need to be transferred to the 2017 Licensing Assembly sitting. On the proposition of Mr C S Jones and seconded by Mr J H Moulin, it was recommended that the application for Sixth Category Licences by Citriche Ltd on behalf of Augres Garage and Haute Croix Stores be unanimously recommended to the Licensing Bench.

ASBT Ltd was represented by Mr C Le Maistre who explained that a provisional First Category Licence was being sought for the Trinity Arms Public House due to substantial refurbishment works to be undertaken next year which would carry them through the transition period. On the proposition of Mr C S Jones and seconded by Mr J Le S Gallichan, it was recommended that the application for a First Category Licence by ABST Ltd was unanimously recommended to the Licensing Bench.

Dodo Restaurant Ltd had no representative and therefore the application was deferred.

Rustic Rentals Ltd was represented by Christopher Nixon who explained that he had been advised to apply for a First Category Licence to enable him to store alcohol to be used at weddings and private events on a sale or return basis. After some discussion, Mr Nixon was advised that he should re-apply for a Sixth Category Licence as he was not proposing to sell alcohol from the Unit at the 24/7 Store. Mr Nixon confirmed that he would take the necessary steps as outlined.

As this was the last Assembly of the year, the Connétable thanked the staff for their assistance throughout the year and wished all those present a Merry Christmas and a Happy and Prosperous New Year which was reciprocated by Mr P R Williams.

There being no further business, the Connétable declared the meeting closed.
